For the past 25 years Christopher Hall has held the position of Director and Chief Executive Officer of the <u>Australian Centre for Grief and Bereavement</u>. He is a psychologist specialising in grief and bereavement.

Chris was elected President of the Association for Death Education and Counseling in 2015. In 2007, he was elected to the Board of Directors of the International Work Group on Dying, Death and Bereavement and served as chair from 2010–2013. He currently serves as the Secretary/Treasurer of the work group.

The Association for Death Education and Counseling in 2018 awarded him the ADEC Service Award for his commitment to the field and advancing the study of dying, death and bereavement.

Chris is a Fellow of the Australian Institute of Management. Chris is also an Honorary Fellow of the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Melbourne. He serves as the Editor of the journal *Grief Matters: The Australian Journal of Grief and Bereavement* and is a former Associate Editor of *Death Studies*. In 2010 Chris was appointed to the Coronial Council of Victoria.
